1	Creed	A statement of firmly held beliefs
1	Liturgical	A set form of worship usually following agreed words
1	Non-Liturgical	A form of worship which is not set
2	39 Articles of Religion	A historical record of beliefs held by the Church of England
2	Anoint	Apply oil to a person's head as a sign of holiness and God's approval
2	Sacrament	An important Christian ceremony
2	Eucharist	A ceremony commemorating the Last Supper involving bread and wine
3	Prayer	A way of communicating with God
4	Pilgrimage	A journey to a religious or holy place
4	Shrine	A holy place
5	Epiphany	A moment of suddenly revealing something surprising or great
5	Prophecy	A message from God in which he communicates his will
5	Vigil	Staying awake at night in order to pray; usually on the eve of festivals
6	Missionary	A person who preaches and invites people to convert to Christianity
6	Pentecostalism	A Protestant movement that places emphasis on a direct and personal relationship with God through the holy spirit
6	Evangelism	Preaching the gospel in order to attract the new believers
7	Ecumenism	A movement that tries to bring different Christian denominations closer together
7	Outreach	An activity to provide services to people in need
8	Persecution	The ill-treatment of an individual/group usually on the grounds of religion, politics or ethnicity
8	Reconciliation	Restoring peace and friendship between individuals or groups
