Dear parents and carers

Now that the exams are officially over, we wanted to remind you of some important information.

Access to School Site

Year 11 students are no longer required to attend school and should not return to the site during the school day, unless a staff member has made an arrangement to meet with them. This is to ensure that the school can maintain a calm, safe and focused environment for those students who are still in full-time education. If your young person feels they need to come on site for any reason, they should email a member of staff to arrange a suitable time.

Leavers Prom, Friday 3 July

Just to remind you, Prom is taking place on Friday 3 July for those students that are going. The venue is the **Queen's Stand at Epsom Downs Racecourse (KT18 5LU)**. Parking attendants will direct you where to go. **Arrival is from 6.30pm, and no later than 7.00pm.** We'll be sitting down to begin dinner at 7.15pm. **Carriages at 11pm.** Please message your young person once you arrive to collect, to let them know you are there. We cannot allow any students to make their own way home; they must be collected by an adult.

Donating Old Uniform in Good Condition

If your young person still has items of uniform in good condition that you no longer need, we would be really glad to take these off you to help other families. This can be dropped to our Reception Team, open between 08:30 and 16:30 Monday to Friday during term time or your young person can bring it with them when they collect their results on 20 August.

Collecting GCSE results on Thursday, 20 August

We are looking forward to welcoming students into school to collect results in person from 10:00-12:00. If your young person will not be available to collect their results, someone else, such as a family member or friend, can collect for them if they bring written permission from your young person with them. **Results will also be emailed to all students' Carrington School email addresses as a PDF by 15:00.** We are not able to send Student's results to anyone except them. The PDF of the results should be saved so they have these to provide to colleges and for future reference.



Year Books and Results Certificates

In December the Exam Boards will send us the formal certificates for all our students' GCSE and BTEC qualifications and your young person will need to collect these so they can keep them safely for use as evidence of their qualifications in the future. We will invite your young person to come and collect these and will be giving out the Year Books at the same event. We will be in touch again by email during October, with the date and time for this.

Make a Difference, Make a Donation

As you may be aware we have a support fund for students called the [ACE Foundation](#), which helps students from lower-income families to go on trips and excursions that are beyond the family's means. Some of you may have benefitted from this support. Support Outside of School

As students complete Year 11 and move on to college, apprenticeships, or employment, we recognise that this transition can bring excitement but also uncertainty for both young people and their families. We want to reassure you that professional support is available from various agencies outside school. If you have any worries about wellbeing, mental health, safety, or your next steps, we encourage students and parents to speak to a trusted adult or to access professional services. Locally, support is available through Surrey's Children's Single Point of Access (C-SPA) on 0300 470 9100 and Mind Works Surrey on 0300 222 5755 for emotional wellbeing and mental health support. National services are also available, including Childline (0800 1111), which offers free, confidential advice for young people, and the NSPCC helpline (0808 800 5000) for adults concerned about a child. In an emergency, please always contact 999, or for urgent health advice call NHS 111. We strongly encourage students and families to reach out early to these services; seeking help is a positive step, and there are professionals ready to listen and support you during this important transition.

We hope you have a good summer, and we look forward to seeing your young person on 3 July or later in August.
