Dear parents and carers

The Immunisation Team visited school recently to deliver the **DTP and MenACWY vaccinations to students in Year 9**. If you missed this opportunity and would like your young person to receive this vaccination, please complete the e-consent by visiting [www.surreyimmunisations.co.uk](http://www.surreyimmunisations.co.uk) and entering Carrington's unique code **SR143903**

The team will be revisiting school on **Friday 6 March and Friday 20 March**, and, on completion of the consent form, your young person will be added to the list to be seen on this date. **If you have previously given consent you should not complete this form again.**

If **you do not** want your young person to receive a vaccine, please still complete a consent form and select the 'No' box.

These vaccinations are recommended to help protect your child as follows:

**DTP is a 3-in-1 vaccination to protect against:**

- Diphtheria – a serious disease that can damage the heart, nervous system and in severe cases may kill.
- Tetanus – a painful disease affecting the nervous system.
- Polio – a virus that attacks the nervous system and can cause paralysis and can kill.

This vaccination, given in school in year 9, would complete the baby injections given pre-school. Your child needs a total of five doses of tetanus, diphtheria and polio to build up and maintain immunity. If you are unsure if your child has had their 4 previous doses, please check your child's red book, where their early childhood vaccinations are recorded.

**Meningococcal ACWY**

This vaccine protects against the four main groups of meningococcal bacteria that can cause meningitis (infection of the layers that surround the brain and spinal cord) and septicaemia (blood poisoning).

Meningococcal disease is rare but very serious and can lead to amputation, hearing loss, brain damage and scars. These diseases are known to affect older adolescents, especially if they go to university or training where they are living in accommodation with other young people.
