Welcome from the Head


My vision for our students has been to improve the quality of teaching & learning and to increase opportunities and experiences for every student that we are privileged to teach.

The Role

We are seeking to appoint an energetic and enthusiastic farm hand who has a love of animals but is also keen and able to work with young people. The successful candidate will be able to demonstrate their ability to think strategically to ensure the health and welfare of the animals that we are looking after, as well as ensuring a safe learning environment for the students.

The role of the Farm Hand will be to support the staff team in looking after all aspects of farm duties including animal welfare, farm cleaning, feeding and working with students of the school to enhance their opportunities for learning. We are looking for a proactive person with a positive can-do attitude and good people skills.

Over the coming months we are looking to develop a small team to provide a regular set of hours across the week / weekends and through the school holidays. Work will be on a rota with a minimum of 8 hours a week guaranteed to all successful candidates.

The successful candidate will be an excellent team player who is excited by working in an ambitious environment. They will also need to be able to work autonomously and to have the initiative to take ownership of the day-to-day operational running of the farm which may include ordering food and provisions and building pens and play areas with the school

Role Description

The Role

Post Title: Farm Hand

Line Manager: TBC

Pay: £11.50 ph

(minimum 8 hours pw)

Aim: To provide appropriate animal welfare and care to the animals being held by the school

Responsibilities

- To attend the school for approximately 2 hours a day (including weekends/school holidays) to look after the hens and goats and some small animals, as necessary
- To be experienced enough to take responsibility for ensuring they are fed correctly and cleaned, cared for as necessary to support growth and development. To maintain appropriate health and safety measures
- To be available to support and / or lead after school / lunch time clubs to raise the profile of animal care among the students

- To care for the animals during school holidays and at the weekend
- To tend to and support the required gardening in our small allotment areas.
- To bring ideas and initiative to the team to help develop and grow the farm and to raise funds to support it day to day
- To be able to assist in parties and holiday camps for our local community as required (paid for by booking)



Role Description Continued

Duties will include

- Mucking out animals and cleaning pens
- Clearing the field of muck to ensure it can be used for sports
- Feeding and watering animal
- Walking the goats with students
- Interacting with the public
- General animal healthcare
- Creating and building safe play areas for the animals
- Recording any information in the welfare log

The above-mentioned duties are neither exclusive nor exhaustive, duties and responsibilities of the post may change as requirements and circumstances change. The post holder may be required to carry out such other duties as requested by management that are broadly within the level of the post.
