Skirt Uniform

- Charcoal grey blazer*
- Grey tartan skirt*
- Teal jumper* (optional)
- White revere collared shirt (long or short sleeved)
- Black leather school shoes/Black leather trainers



Trouser Uniform

- Charcoal grey blazer*
- Teal and grey tie*
- Teal Jumper* (optional)
- Black trousers (short tailored trousers are acceptable between Easter and October half term)
- White collared shirt (long or short sleeved)
- Black leather school shoes or black leather trainers(not mesh)

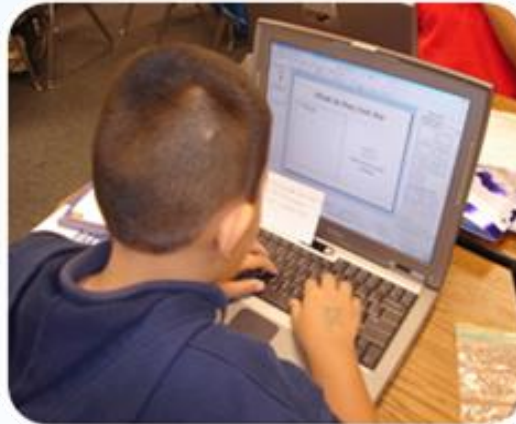

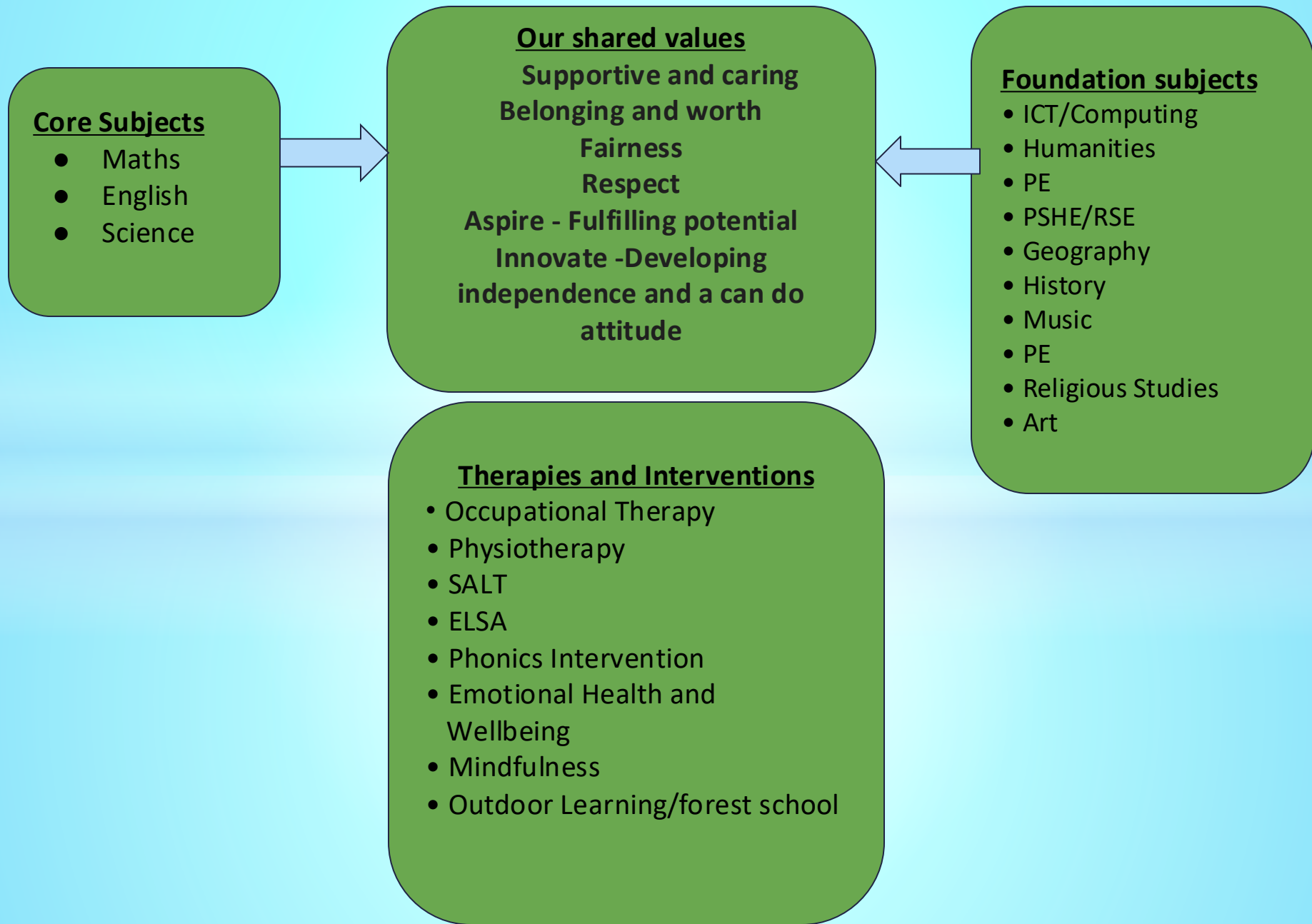
